


Annual Report 2016-2017




Hello all! The current 2017 Treasurer's Annual Report is as follows:

Positive growth in the association accounts are attributed to a productive review of post-conference expenses and reacting to mismatched spending. We also set a per person budget for each conference based on the fees collected.

- Attendance at conferences is averaging up to **35** paid participants with a **40%** profit ratio per conference.
- Membership dues remain constant at approximately **70** paid members a year.
- We will work to secure more sponsors for conferences and other fundraising to support the scholarship initiatives as well as bolster the general fund for security.
- We seek to add in as many details to the NCAEHA By-Laws that will create a better layer of security as well as continuity of operation.
